### FOCUS

✓ **Social Enterprises** providing **Social Services** that face nowadays multiple challenges.

✓ **Work integration Social Enterprises (WISEs)** that have to cope with new categories of disadvantaged workers (immigrants, long term unemployed, etc.), that have specific characteristics and needs.

✓ **Social enterprises** involved in **Public – Social Partnerships.** Public Social Partnership (PSP) is a new approach to public social service delivery, based on the model of the PPP.
